PRICING

Camp is priced at \$780/wk for high school and youth sessions, and \$330 for mini camp. Family camp prices vary based on housing preference. Retreats have tiered pricing at \$175/100/50 levels and are paid as able. Work weekend is no cost. Part of the BCH mission is that everyone be able to participate in camp regardless of financial barriers. CAMPERSHIPS are available in abundance. Anyone can apply when registering.

WHAT SETS US APART

Mental Health Programs

Our Mental Health Program gives all BCH campers the opportunity to attend a mental health workshop where they learn about verbalizing emotions, building coping skills, and more. This is a safe, resourced, and inclusive space for neurodiversity and those who might need additional support.

Faith-Based Community

Named after the first female Bishop to be ordained in the global Anglican Communion, we are heavily rooted in the traditions and values of the Episcopal Church. Spirituality is the thread that connects all the aspects of our life at camp together with purpose.

Leadership Development

Our Junior Counselor program is for all 15–17 year olds interested in gaining personal and professional leadership skills, working with kids, and growing in relationship with God and the outdoors. This is a paid position.
